Run Sailing with the wind blowing to the rear of the boat.

Parts of the Dinghy

Mainsail The large sail behind the mast

Jib The small sail in front o the mast

Boom The horizontal bar holding the Mainsail

Cunningham Used to tighten the mainsheet at the bottom of the

mast.

Kicker Used to tension the boom

Outhaul Used to put tension across the bottom of the

mainsail.


